

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**SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS**  
**TO BE READ IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE C.W.A.R.C.S.**

**1.0 AUTHORITY:**

The event shall be a Special Stage Rally, conducted under the general provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA, the National Competition Rules (NCR) of the Confederation of Australian Motor Sport Ltd (CAMS), the National Rally Code, the Conditions for West Australian Rally Championships (C.W.A.R.C.S), including the Standard Supplementary Regulations contained therein, these Event Regulations and any Further Regulations which may be issued.

## 2.1 EVENT DETAILS:

**HEADQUARTERS LOCATION:** Old Mill Site, Jarrahdale Road, Jarrahdale

**START LOCATION:** Old Mill Site, Jarrahdale Road, Jarrahdale  
**START DATE:** Saturday 15<sup>th</sup> November 2008.  
**START TIME:** First car starts at: 1200hrs

The Organisers will locate a staging area at the start location. This staging area is not deemed to be a PARC FERME. It is the crew's responsibility to ensure that their vehicle is placed in this staging area before 1100hrs.

**BOOKING IN CONTROL:** Old Mill Site, Jarrahdale Road, Jarrahdale  
**OPENS:** 1000hrs **CLOSES:** 1100hrs

Competitors will not be allowed to Book In if the Organisers have not received their Service Crew Sign-On Sheet.

**CREW BRIEFING:** Will be held at 1115hrs outside Rally Headquarters. This briefing is compulsory BOTH Driver and Co-Driver must attend. Crews failing to attend a crew briefing will not be permitted to start

**FINISH LOCATION:** Old Mill Site, Jarrahdale Road, Jarrahdale  
**FINISH DATE:** Saturday 15<sup>th</sup> November 2008  
**FINISH TIME:** First car finishes at approx. 1600hrs

## 2.2 SCRUTINY:

### PRE EVENT SCRUTINY and DOCUMENTATION

**METRO LOCATION:** Department of Transport Vehicle Licensing Centre, Murray Rd, Welshpool.

**DATE:** Wednesday 12th November 2008  
**TIME:** Commencing at 1800hrs to 2030hrs

**COUNTRY LOCATION:** Old Mill Site, Jarrahdale Road, Jarrahdale

**DATE:** Saturday 15th November 2008  
**TIME:** Commencing at 0930hrs to 1030hrs

Metro competitors MUST attend metro scrutiny Wednesday night at Welshpool. Only genuine Country competitors will be scrutineered at country scrutiny at the Service Park – Country competitors are those competitors residing outside the 50km radius from the Perth Metro GPO.

Competitors are reminded that in accordance with NCR 67, they must present the following items to the pre-event documentation check.

- CAMS Pass Book / Competition Licence. (Competitor, Driver, Co-Driver) – refer Section 2 of the current CAMS Manual for specific licence requirements.
- Current CAMS Affiliated Car Club Membership Card. (Driver, Co-Driver)
- Civil Driving licences for both Crew Members (not required if Co-Driver has a navigator only licence)
- CAMS Vehicle Log Book
- Current Vehicle Licence/Permit/Registration Papers

### RE-PRESENT SCRUTINY:

Re-present scrutiny will be conducted at the Service Park between 0930hrs and 1030hrs

Competitors are reminded that any equipment that is to be fitted to the car during the event e.g. cameras and driving lights MUST be fitted BEFORE and presented for examination at Pre Event Scrutiny.

### POST EVENT SCRUTINY:

At the finish location in the Service Park a designated area - PARC FERME (Please follow road books).

**LOCATION:** Competitors are advised that all vehicles must remain at PARC FERME - Service Park at the Old Mill Site, until the last crew has finished the event, and has passed post event scrutiny (if applicable). Crew will be cleared to remove their vehicles by the Chief Scrutineer or the Clerk of Course only. (Approx 1 hour after last car has finished)

## 2.3 HELMET/CLOTHING/FOOTWEAR SCRUTINY:

Competitors are advised that the Scrutineers will inspect competitor's clothing (driving suits etc) and helmets during Pre-event scrutiny.

## **2.4 PRESENTATION OF VEHICLES:**

Vehicles when presented for Scrutiny must be in a clean condition. There must be no mud or dust on any of the coachwork, engine area, wheel arches or underbody of the vehicle. Excuses of gravel roads and driveways will not be accepted.

## **2.5 ABSORBANT MATERIAL (Kitty Litter):**

All competitive vehicle will be required to carry a 1kg bag of absorbent material (Kitty Litter) in the vehicle. This is to be present and fixed in the car at scrutineering and will be checked at the time control before commencing the event. See also section 5.0 (Oil Spillage) of these regulations.

## **2.6 OK & SOS SIGNAGE:**

Competitors MUST carry the OK - SOS sign at all times. Competitors will be asked to show their signs at the Start Control and also at the Service out controls. Crews will not be able to start the event unless the sign is produced. There will be no extra time given if left behind.

## **2.7 ODOMETER CHECK:**

Competitors will receive their Route Instructions at Documentation and will be able to check their odometer readings prior to event commencement. A Competitor Advice will be issued.

## **2.8 USE OF COURSE PRIOR TO THE EVENT:**

Any competitor found on the course in the period (2) months prior to the start of the rally, will be reported to the Stewards of the meeting and a penalty or exclusion may be imposed by the Stewards.

## **2.9 ALCOHOL / DRUG TESTING:**

During the event, consumption of alcoholic beverages and taking of drugs by competitors, service crews or officials in the paddock, pits or any other portion of the competition is expressly forbidden. Any competitor, crew or official who is found to be affected by alcohol or drugs on the day of the event therefore shall not be permitted to participate in the event. Refer NCR 145A of the Current CAMS Manual.

In addition, the persons concerned will be subject to the Articles of the Procedure of Alcohol Testing and CAMS Ant-Doping Policy. Competitors, crews or officials may be tested for alcohol or other drugs at any time during the event(s). This regulation serves as required 24-hour notice to Competitors, Crew and Officials.

### **2.9.1 OFFICIAL DUTY:**

As per CWARCS 2008 - Appendix V - Rule A14(IV)

1. Event organizers are under no obligation to find an organizing position for you if you have not advised of your availability in sufficient time or all positions have been filled.
2. Individual event organizers will decide what constitutes helping on an event.
3. Officiating in events is not accumulative i.e. doing two events in one year does not let you off for two years.
4. Only the normal number of officials for any particular position will be accepted. E.g. if twenty people turn up at a road closure only three will be nominated on the sign on sheet, the rest are spectators.

5. The onus is on the Driver and/or Co driver to ensure that their presence is recorded. Claims that "I was there but nobody signed my book" will not be accepted.
6. The State Rally Panel at its sole discretion may, after a written submission, grant exemptions to this rule. It would be expected that Rookie Drivers and Co drivers in WA or individuals whose normal place of residence is in a remote area of Western Australia would be granted an exemption.
7. Driver/Co drivers who have not qualified and are not holding a valid exemption at the beginning of the current season are required to qualify for the current season and the following season by being an official at two events in the current season.

Proxies:

The use of proxies will be at the discretion of the Clerk of Course and must be arranged prior to the close of entries

It is the Driver/C-Driver's responsibility to have their record book endorsed accordingly

Please make sure that you have completed your official duties. **NO DUTY - NO PLAY**

### **3.0 CALM INDEMNITY:**

Representatives of the Department of Conservation and Land Management, Forest Products Commission, Department of Environment, Local Authorities and the Water Corporation have not inspected the route or adjacent roads and cannot guarantee that the roads are or will be suitable and safe for the purpose of the rally. Accordingly, each person uses the roads entirely at his or her own risk and exercises their judgment of the speed at which the roads can be traversed with safety.

### **3.1 PUBLIC DRINKING WATER:**

Competitors are reminded that the competitive section of the event is held within a Public Drinking Water Source Area where specific By-Laws apply. These By-Laws may impose restrictions on the activities undertaken in the catchments.

### **4.0 RESULTS:**

Provisional results will be available on the official notice board at Rally Headquarters and will be posted within one hour after the last car has finished. Results will become final one hour later subject to no protests being received (NCR Part XII Page 4.23). ### **4.1 PRESENTATION OF AWARDS:**

Presentation of trophies will be held on Saturday 15<sup>th</sup> November at a venue in Jarrahdale. Further information will be provided by a competitor advice.

### **4.2 TROPHIES:**

Trophies will be awarded to driver and co-driver for 1<sup>st</sup> to 3<sup>rd</sup> Outright, 1<sup>st</sup> Rookie, and the Most Consistent driver and co-driver. A clubman masters/ineligible competitor trophy will also be awarded if five (5) or more entries in that category are received.

### **4.3 THE MOST CONSISTENT TROPHY:**

A trophy will be awarded to both driver and co-driver where their stage time, excluding road penalties, is one of the five fastest on every special stage.

#### **4.4 CLUBMAN MASTERS TROPHY:**

A clubman master's ie: entries who do not meet the eligibility criteria (See CWARCS D3 (iv) to (vi)), trophy will be awarded to the highest placed driver and co-driver, only if the number of clubman masters or ineligible vehicles, as a combined group exceeds five.

#### **5.0 SERVICE:**

There will be a designated central service park at the Old Mill Site, Jarrahdale Road, Jarrahdale. All servicing will be restricted to the designated service area. All vehicle servicing MUST be carried out on a tarpaulin, which must be placed under the entire perimeter of the competition vehicle. The penalty for servicing outside the designated area is exclusion or servicing without a tarp under the entire perimeter of the vehicle, a \$500 fine will be incurred.

Speed limit in service park is 10km per hour (walking pace). Any crew breaching the speed limits will incur a \$100.00 fine.

#### **5.1 NO ENTRY AREAS IN SERVICE PARK:**

The area used for the Service Park has a Heritage Listing, and certain areas are not to be accessed for any reason. Refer to your road book page 4 - The out of bounds areas are: The circular tank and the wooden shed area. These areas will be clearly bunted off. Anyone found in this area will be subject to a fine of \$500.00 and possible prosecution by the local authorities.

#### **5.2 FUEL REQUIREMENTS:**

**Service 1** Total distance to service approx 73km with 37km competitive.  
**Finish** Total distance from last service approx 82km with 32km competitive

#### **5.3 REFUELLING**

A designated refueling area will be set aside with time allowed for refueling from competitors own containers. Refueling outside this area is strictly prohibited. Engines must be switched off with both crew members outside the vehicle whilst the vehicle is being refueled. Refueling may be carried out by either registered service crew and/or competitors who must wear suitable neck to wrist to ankle non-flammable clothing and closed in footwear. Ref: Rule A13 2008 CWARCS.

Smoking in this area and within a 20 metre perimeter of this area will result in a recommendation to the stewards of exclusion from the event.

#### **5.4 OIL SPILLAGE:**

As the event is running in a drinking water catchments any oil spillage needs to be cleaned up. Service Park Officials, Start and Stop Control Officials and the Sweeper will be equipped with oil absorbent material. If a competitor's vehicle produces an oil spill, if they are continuing, the competitor should mark the location of the spill in their road book and notify Headquarters of the location of the spill. If competitors remain with their vehicle at the location of the oil spill, then Sweeper will provide oil absorbent material and a plastic bag for the spill to be cleaned up by competitors. A penalty of \$500 will apply if these conditions are not adhered to. This is now very important, since we are required to adhere to a strict Environmental Management Plan when undertaking activities in drinking water catchment areas.

## 6.0 SPECTATING:

There will be one (1) spectator point, (to view two stages) being 7.44 km from the Service Park to Frollett road. Spectator information will be available at the start location, Old Mill Site, Jarrahdale Road, Jarrahdale.

## 7.0 ARROWING ON STAGES:

At all junctions, which require a change of direction, an arrow will be erected on the side of the road, approx. 20 metres before the junction. Note: Straight on at junctions will NOT be arrowed.

## 8.0 LIGHTING:

In the interest of road safety and advice from the State Rally Advisory Panel all competitors and Service Crews are **STRONGLY RECOMMENDED TO ILLUMINATE VEHICLE HEADLIGHTS ON ALL LIAISONS.**

## 9.0 NO PETS:

Animals and Motor sport do not mix: pets are not permitted at this event.

## 10.0 FOOD:

There will be **NO** food and drinks available for purchase in the service area on the day. There is a General Store in Jarrahdale that have a great variety of food and drinks.

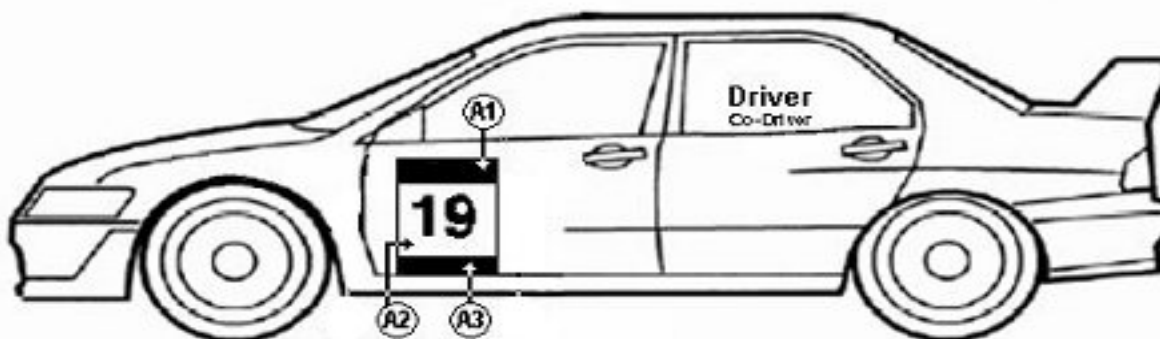
## 11.0 QUIET ZONE:

The whole of Jarrahdale Town site and the liaison roads to and from the town site are designated as Quiet Zones - see *NRC 7.2 Page 11.14.*
